Day 2 began with an engaging visit to Ullico, where CEO Brian Hale inspired Fellows with insights into Ullico's unique role intersecting labor and finance. The group then learned the basics of pension fund accounting from Mary Margaret Prange of Calibre CPA Group. Finally, Steve Sleigh and Debbie Nisson, LCS Fellowship Founders, provided a comprehensive overview of pensions—what they are, how they are governed, how their capital is sourced and an overview of the flow of capital.

Over lunch at AFL-CIO headquarters,
Fellows explored labor's influence in
financial markets with **Brandon Rees** and **Carin Zelenko**, who spoke on corporate
governance and capital strategies. **Alex Jacquez** of the Groundwork
Collaborative added insights on
industrial and sustainable finance,
rounding out a dynamic conversation on
labor, policy, and capital.





Day 2 finished with a presentation at the LiUNA offices with a presentation by **Erin Hutson** and **Jennifer O'Dell** of the Corporate Affairs team, joined by members of their staff. They shared LiUNA's history and discussed the strategies used to assess responsible investing for their pension funds.

Fellows were joined by HIT team members, and other host partners, like the AFL-CIO and Ullico, as well as former fellows and current LCS board members.




